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
Living with the COVID-19 virus

The reality today is that the virus is not going away easily and we will have to live with it for a longer period of time similar to the flu.




Our progress in 2021 is enabled by the effective management of Covid-19 risks. (1/2)



- ✓ 1) Shift from large-area community quarantines and blanket restrictions to alert level system and granular lockdowns.
- ✓ 2) Shift risks area from general to the 3C's (closed space, crowds, close contact).
- √ 3) Acceleration of the vaccination program and reduced restrictions for those vaccinated.
- √ 4) Removal of mobility restrictions based on age.

√ 6) Increase in transport capacity to 75 to 100 percent.




√ 7) Reduction in requirements when traveling, whether domestic or international, especially for those vaccinated.



√ 8) Removal of face shield requirement for areas under alert levels 1 to 3.




Philippine economic growth is beginning to recover, and sustainability will depend on the actions we take in dealing with the virus.






On a seasonally adjusted quarter-on-quarter basis, the economy expanded by 3.8 percent. This indicates sustained recovery despite two weeks of ECQ and a month of MECQ in Q3.






Strong recovery of manufacturing continues in the third quarter of 2021.

Purchasing managers index for the PHL



Merchandise exports growth




Strong recovery of imports continues in the third quarter of 2021.

Unemployment rate



Underemployment rate



Visits to public transport stations have strongly improved compared to last year even during ECQ.


Transit stations (Google mobility) Q2 2020: 80% down

Visits to workplaces have strongly improved compared to last year even during ECQ.







- 3. Maximize the use of the 2021 and 2022 budgets.






DOH sees active COVID-19 cases in PH dropping to 6,000 by Dec. 15

COVID-19 cases have continuously gone down from its peak of 26,000 on September 11 to around 1,000 in the past week due to our rapid vaccination drive, better risk management, and public cooperation.

New COVID cases reached the lowest level since early-2020.



As of 21 November, a total of 75.6 million vaccine doses have been rolled out. Of this, 42.0 million doses were administered as the first dose and 33.6 million were administered as the complete dose.

Vaccine doses that have been administered across priority groups as of 21 November 2021














☐ 1) Reduce artificial barriers to vaccination.
